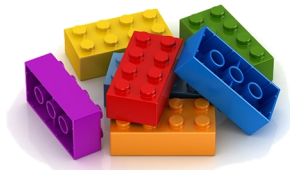

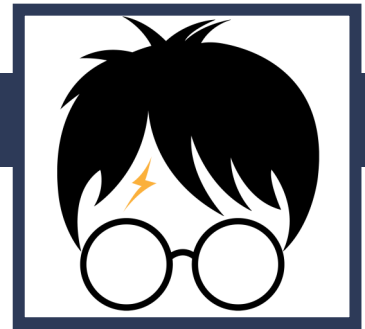

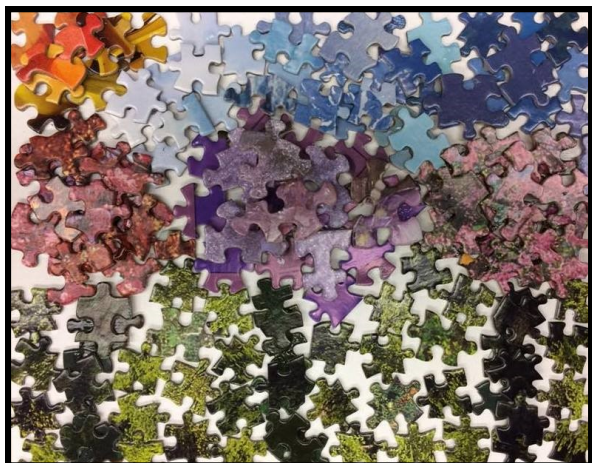
### **A LOOK BEHIND ORSON WELLES' WAR OF THE WORLDS**
