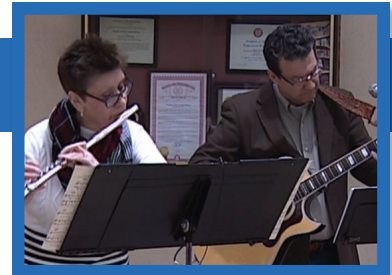


## GRAND FOLK TRIO, Thursday, March 17
